All trustees of the Friends had the benefit of a full presentation and an extensive O&A on the scheme with the developer and their architects earlier in the year and they were unanimous in their support for this world class facility. They were impressed with the efforts made by the developer to come forward with a design that adheres to strong sustainability principles and has a low visual impact on Loch Lomond. The proposed design successfully respects the special historic landscape setting of Ross Priory at the southern end of Loch

Lomond.

The development will result in upgrading a run down area

on the Ross Priory Estate and secure a number of

improvements to the Ross Priory Boat Club facilities and the associated buildings. We are also pleased that the developer will contribute a six figure sum to support improvements to the fabric of historic Ross Priory.

We delayed the submission of our response as we were keen to ensure the developer reviewed the plans for sewage disposal as we shared the concerns of the angling and environmental bodies about the potential impact of effluent disposal on the Endrick Water Special Area of Conservation which is home to many nationally and internationally important fish species. We were pleased to receive confirmation recently that the developer has agreed to invest an additional £700,000 in connecting the development to the main sewage system which successfully addresses these concerns. The Leadership Centre and visitor accommodation buildings will greatly strengthen the range of facilities

buildings will greatly strengthen the range of facilities available at Ross Priory and are in accordance with many of the policies in the National Park Development Plan. We commend the plans.
